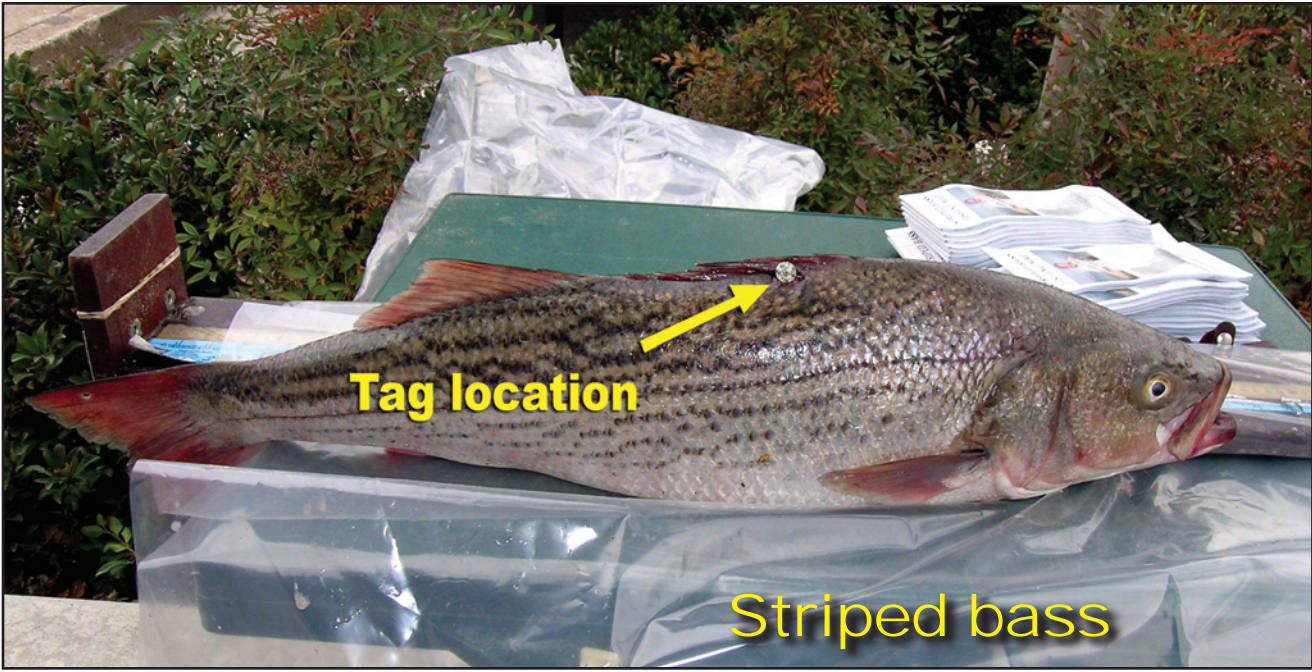

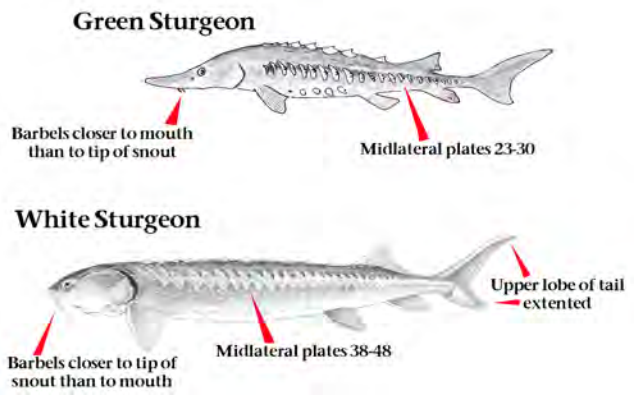

Certificate of Appreciation

Catch and release with care

- Be prepared to catch and release before you catch that fish!
- ✓ Keep the fish in the water.
 - ✓ Wet your hands or wear wet cotton gloves to handle the fish.
 - ✓ Remove the hook quickly.
 - ✓ Don't play the fish to exhaustion.
 - ✓ Hold the fish upright and facing the current until it is able to swim away.
 - ✓ Hold the fish horizontally for pictures - not by its gills.

Is it green or white?



White sturgeon are gray with a uniform pale belly. They are caught much more often than green sturgeon.

Green sturgeon are olive green with a dark stripe on belly. Their scutes are more prominent than white sturgeon scutes.
