

UNION GETS STATE CONTRACT

The Union Oil Company of California last month was awarded a contract for supplying oil and gasoline to the State of California for a year beginning September 1. The contract for the year represents about \$30,000.00

MONTEBELLO CARRIES MOLASSES

The Union Oil Company's tanker Montebello, which last month carried refined oil to the Union Oil Company's new station at Honolulu, returned with a cargo of molasses for account of the California Hawaiian Sugar Refining Company. This "sweet" cargo was loaded into six of the crude oil tanks at Hilo, and was discharged into a specially built molasses tank at San Pedro, to await completion of the sugar refinery now in course of completion.

SERVICE STATIONS FOR HONOLULU

Within the next three months, Honolulu will be equipped with a series of service stations built and operated by Union Oil Company of California. Their completion will offer a service that has not hitherto been available to motorists on the Island, and also gives to the Union Oil Company of California the honor of being the first of the several large oil companies doing business in Hawaii to establish service stations. Other distributing points in addition to the four now building will be established, and H. B. Weller, manager in Hawaii, is studying the city for the most suitable sites, taking into consideration future growth and trend of traffic.

In addition to the service stations that are now building, the Union Oil Company of California has recently completed and moved into its large new plant covering four acres, in Iwilei.
