Site history, stand age, comments: Dry lake bed dominated by what could be a species of Ambrosia (According to seed). The soil is clay and is very dry and deeply cracked. Pillars are approximately 4-6 inches apart and as deep as 18". The pillars crumble into sharp edged dirt clods. I wasn't able to rehydrate the clods but it was finely textured, likely FISC or FICL. ID'd as Dysphania ambrosioides by JBD & K. Hickman.
