- Initial Site Safety Officer
- Operations Staff
- Air Monitoring (responders)
- Hazardous Waste Quantification
- Salvage Operations
- Maritime / Pipeline Subject Matter Experts
- Causal Analysis

- Initial Assessment of Site
- Request of Additional Responders
- Site Safety
- Establish Incident Command
 Federal
 - Responsible Party
- Determine ICS Roles / Authorities
- Determine Resource Needs

Incident Conclusion



- Terminate Emergency Phase Response
- Determine Environmental Endpoints
- Document Environmental Damage
- Restoration
- Post Incident Issues
 - After Action Report
 - Civil Litigation
